From the desk of Rabbi Asch

It comes as a surprise to no one that we are in the midst of an election. I, like you, have been overwhelmed by TV ads, mailings to my house and phone calls reminding me to vote, and making an argument about who to support. I, like you, might be ready for this election to be over! However, on this eve of Election Day I wanted to say a few words about voting and our Civic Engagement efforts at Temple Beth El.

Our amazing Civic Engagement team was led by Jay Collins with help from Bob Adler, Chuck Cohen, Ellen Freed and Mike Levey. They provided detailed information about voting to all of you through our weekly email and a mailing to every member of the congregation. Their efforts were part of a national effort by the [Religious Action Center of the Union for Reform Judaism](#). You can learn more about the campaign [here](#) and join in the [post election call](#) on November 11th to hear how we, as a Reform Movement, engaged almost 500,000 voters. That is impressive! I want to encourage everyone to vote (if you have not already) and invite you to fill out this very [brief survey](#) from our Civic Engagement Team. It will help us track our congregational efforts. Finally, I want to remind you that it is likely we will not know the results on November 3rd. Please be patient and encourage others to be patient as we wait for every vote to be counted.

As we head past the election and into the winter at TBE, we have a lot planned. Look for more information about our Hanukkah celebrations, another visit from Frankie Sandmel, our newly imagined online Ice Storm Wine Tasting, and more. While the changing of seasons brings some excitement, it also might bring dread or anxiety for many of you. Please do not hesitate to reach out to me if I or the Temple can be of any help in the months to come. The phone lines and video links are always open.

The last few weeks we have heard from Rabbis Isaacs, Saks, and Solochek about why they vote. I wanted to close this column with my answer to that question.

Ever since I can remember, my parents took me with them to vote. Voting day was special. We walked to our polling place, cast our ballots, and got our stickers. Now, as a parent, I look forward to taking my children to vote with me. As we drive around town in the months leading up to an election, they ask me which offices people are running for and who their opponent is. They love to count how many yard signs they see. Aaron recently remarked that Central Street was Maureen AuCoin territory while Academy Street is for George LaPointe (both are candidates for mayor of Hallowell). For me, voting is one piece of being an informed and engaged citizen. I am conscious that my Jewish ancestors were not allowed to be citizens of the countries in which they lived. I am so grateful to live in a democratic country where my religion does not limit my political involvement. My husband serves on the school board, and I lobby my representatives and bring my Jewish values to bear on the issues of the day. Our democracy requires that we bring our full selves, including our Jewish values, into the voting booth and the civic arena. Much as we are commanded to pass the Torah down to our children, I believe we must pass down to them the importance of being informed and engaged citizens who vote, lobby their representatives, and stand up for what they believe. Voting is my civic duty and Jewish responsibility.

Our Temple is a Special Community

When I arrived in Central Maine, many years ago, and found Temple Beth El, I was stunned by a place so different from the congregation I had left behind. I came from Newton, Massachusetts, “the old country,” as described by Rabbi Susan and Jet Price. I was invited into the Sisterhood by the elegant elders, Charlotte Goos, Lila Segal, Edith Katz, and Lenora Dana. I was never able to pour tea with the finesse expected of me. Having sat behind the mehitzah in my grandmother’s shul, I wasn’t comfortable with the strict separation of gender roles. I was told, at TBE, “This is how we’ve always done it.” How we’ve evolved.

There were many years when I participated in meetings as a TBE Board Member which included the hard-fought decision to affiliate with the Reform Movement. That was a period of challenge and change for our congregation. I rode through times of visiting rabbis, some more skilled than others. We progressed toward hiring our own Rabbi Susan and then Rabbi Asch. They have blessed us with their presence and guided us through the growth we’ve experienced as a congregation.

Time has moved quickly for my family. There were years of Hebrew school, starting with Bella Sewall tutoring eight year old Nate before he was in class with Gabe Freiman who is now his neighbor, friend, and fellow dad in Brooklyn. This congregation held me through the deaths of close family members and friends, a divorce, a conversion, a marriage, and family B’nai Mitzvah. I think back on preparing for my own with Nancy Schatz and Lynn Slosberg and am left chuckling.

We’ve mourned the loss of many congregants, spouses, parents, siblings and children. Ours is a community that lets us lean when we need to. We care for each other with compassion and humor under the guidance of our Rabbi and Board of Directors. The strength of our community builds with each new member and the relationships we nurture amongst those who have longstanding connection to TBE.

We’ve taken on significant challenges to function as a congregation during a worldwide pandemic. Our Hebrew School thrives, services and study sessions continue. We celebrate our holidays and will gather in new formation for our annual ice storm commemorative wine tasting and auction. The synagogue remodeling project was more extensive, costly, and time consuming than we had thought it would be but the results are impressive. We continue to reach out to congregants in need and encourage our cohorts to become civilly engaged by taking seriously the right to vote. We continue to explore social justice issues in our discussions and plans for action.

Our strength lies in the relationships we build here. Friendships flourish. Many of us can’t be with family members so, as Stephen Stills sang, “if you can’t be with the one you love.... Love the one you’re with....” For those who indulge my mothering and grand mothering needs, I thank you. On the Board, Judy Plano, Deb Sewall, and I are the “women of a certain age” as labeled by the wise and generous Sarah Shed. We may not be as elegant or able at the tea table as the elders who came before us, but we show up and offer what we can. I love our TBE Community and can’t imagine still being in the congregation of thousands from my youth. This is where I belong. I encourage you to increase your connections to our community in whatever ways you can. Share your strengths and talents.

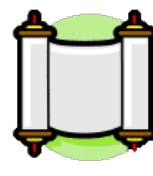
