From the desk of Rabbi Asch

Growing up in California, I did not experience the change of seasons. Nice crept into nicer, crept into nicest. The advantages were many—no snow pants, snow tires, ice storms, mud season, black flies, well, you get the picture. The disadvantage is that you do not really appreciate the changing of the seasons. There is no burst of euphoria at the first nice spring day, no marveling at the fall foliage or the first blossoming of forsythia.

This year, I am feeling the coming of spring even more keenly as it offers us the opportunity to once again gather together in person. While we have done an admirable job offering online opportunities for community, worship, and study online, I, like many of you, are looking forward to seeing one another (masked) face to (masked) face.



As we move toward holding more in-person events, I would like to lift up the work of the Covid task force and the Board for creating and implementing our plan. The technology committee is also playing a large role in making sure we have the equipment and connections needed to stream our services. I also want to extend a huge thank you to Susan Bakaley Marshall, who has been coordinating our Bikkur Holim/Caring Committee. She has recruited and coordinated volunteers so we could continue supporting one another during this past year, even when we could not see one another in person. - 3. **Volunteer**. It will take extra volunteers to make our in-person events work. We will need help with set up and clean up as there are a lot more moving pieces. We will probably also need some technical assistance running Zoom. As you know, our community runs on volunteers.
- 4. **Be a mensch**. We'll all mess up occasionally. When someone reminds you to wear your mask properly, do it. RSVP to events so we can be ready for you. Make an effort to meet some new people.

We have had quite a year together. As we move into spring it can be tempting to want to jump right back into our pre-Covid lives. But, we know we have to move more slowly both for our own physical and mental health. It has been a difficult year for many of us. Some of us are still struggling. Some will struggle even more in the year to come. Jewish tradition reminds us that we, as a people, have gone through ups and downs. We are now in the period of the omer, the counting from our release from slavery Egypt to our moment of covenant at Mount Sinai. And right after the revelation we built the Golden Calf. We were forgiven, and then we were told we had to wander for 40 more years before entering the Promised Land. We entered, but Moses was not leading us. Our entire story has been one of these oscillations. This moment in time is no different. Wherever the next year takes us, we are privileged to support one another on our journey.

If all goes according to plan, on May 23rd, the date of our annual meeting, Cree Krull will be elected as Temple President. After four years as president, this the right time for a change both for me personally and for the Temple as an institution. I have the utmost confidence that Cree will be an excellent president and that he is the right man to lead us forward at this time.

While I'm not totally riding off into the sunset (I'll still be board member and will fill the role of Immediate Past President) I want to take this opportunity say thank you. First, I want to thank the current Board as well as each of the prior Boards during my presidency. Each of the Boards have been diligent, patient and a pleasure to work with. Individually, Board members have shown themselves to be of both great intellect and integrity. While there have been disagreements over the years, we have done so without being disagreeable.

Second, I want to thank you all, the Temple Beth El Congregation. Thanks for having confidence in me and giving me the opportunity to serve. Thanks for being receptive to new ideas and being flexible and adaptive during uncertain times and changing circumstances. I have said on a number of occasions that this is a special community. After four years as being the president, I feel stronger in this belief than ever.

Finally, I want to thank Rabbi Asch. During the past four years, she has been a mentor, partner and inspiration. We are so lucky to have her as our rabbi and spiritual leader.

It is through all your efforts that we have accomplished what I consider to be some big things, including:

- Successfully implementing the Terumah, or free will offering, system of financial support. By doing so, we have the eliminated the barrier of fixed dues to membership, added many new members while at the same time maintaining the Temple's financial affairs in good order.
- -Completely renovating our shul. The project addressed a number of maintenance items which had long been deferred, safety and accessibility issues, and created a truly stunning and welcoming place to conduct our worship services and meetings.
- Taking on a number of social justice issues and projects such as: being a lead participant in proposing and advocating that local school districts adopt a religious holiday observance policy; participating in the Religious Action Center's Civic Engagement project which provided our congregation with information and tools on how they could safely vote in the election being held during the pandemic; and instituting an ongoing discussion among our congregation on racism and diversity and how we, on an individual and community basis might be able to address these issues.
- -Quickly and smoothly transitioning to the Zoom platform to conduct our services, celebrations and meetings shortly after the beginning of the COVID pandemic. This included conducting meaningful High

What's happening at TBE

NOTICE OF ANNUAL MEETING AND PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGE

Pursuant to Article 4 and Article 11 of the Temple's Bylaws, notice is provided to TBE's membership that the TBE Annual Meeting has been called for May 23, 2021 commencing at 10:00 a.m. As part of the Annual Meeting the following amendments to TBE's Bylaws shall be proposed by the TBE Board of Directors:

- 1. Amend Article 6, Section 1 by eliminating the second sentence that reads:"He/she shall appoint all committees and committee chairs."
- 2. Amend Article 6, Section 1 by eliminating the third sentence and replacing it with the following language: "With the exception of the Rabbi Committee, the president shall be an ex-officio member of all committees established pursuant to the provisions of Article 9. In addition, the president shall carry out such duties as usually pertain to this office."
- 3. Amend Article 9, Section 1 by renumbering the subsections so they run consecutively.
- 4. Amend Article 9, Section 1(a) by eliminating "Hebrew School Committee" and replacing it with "Building and Security Committee."
- 5. Amend Article 9, Section 1(c) by eliminating "Special Events Committee" and replacing it with "Social Justice Committee."
- 6. Amend Article 9, Section 2 by striking the first sentence and replacing it with: Standing committees shall consist of a minimum of three members, at least one of which shall be a Director. Standing committee members and the chairpersons of such committees shall be appointed by the Board and shall serve for terms of 3 years with terms to be staggered to ensure continuity. The Board may appoint other ad hoc committees as needed. To the extent feasible, in making such appointments, the Board shall seek the advice of the Nominating Committee established pursuant to the provisions of Article 5, Section 1."

As a result of such amendments Article 6, Section 1 shall now read:

"The president shall preside at all meetings of Temple Beth El. With the exception of the Rabbi Committee, the president shall be an ex-officio member of all committees established pursuant to the provisions of Article 9. In addition, the president shall carry out such duties as usually pertain to this office."

Article 9, Section 1 shall now read:

"There shall be the following standing committees:

- a. Building and Security Committee
- b. Ritual Committee
- c. Social Justice Committee
- d. Development (fund raising) Committee
- e. Rabbi Committee

Article 9, Section 2 shall now read:

"Standing committees shall consist of a minimum of three members, at least one of which shall be a Director. Standing committee members and the chairpersons of such committees shall be appointed by the Board and shall serve for terms of 3 years with terms to be staggered to ensure continuity. The Board may appoint other ad hoc committees as needed. To the extent feasible, in making such appointments, the Board shall seek the advice of the Nominating Committee established pursuant to the provisions of Article 5, Section 1. No committees, subsidiary units, or members shall incur any debt or liability upon Temple Beth El without approval of the Board of Directors."
