Logistics for In-Person Services at TBE

For those of you joining us in person, please look for the greeter outside of TBE. They will tell you where to find your nametag and remind you to take a prayer book (*machzor*). Please note that the doors will be locked 10 minutes after the start of services. If you arrive later, a greeter will open the door for you. Please be patient as you wait for them to arrive. You will asked to enter through the function area into the back of the sanctuary.

Second Day of Rosh Hashanah — Outside

Join us for outdoor services to mark the second day of Rosh Hashanah. We'll begin at 8:30am, at the home of Fran Rudoff, for a service including the sounding of the shofar, a Torah reading, and prayers and songs to welcome the new year. At 10:00am we'll join together for Torah study. Prayer books and texts will be provided. Please bring your own chair. All are welcome to stay for brunch beginning at 11:00am. We welcome additional contributions of food or drinks. RSVPs to the office are encouraged but not required.

There should be parking in front of the barn and in the driveway. Someone will be there to direct you.

Directions to Fran's House from Augusta or Gardiner:

From Augusta: Take 95 south.

- Take Exit to 295 and go through the toll booth.
- Take the exit immediately after the toll booth (Gardiner/Litchfield).
- Make a right onto 9/126 west.
- Continue with directions from Gardiner below...

From Gardiner: Take 9/126 west out of Gardiner.

- At the roundabout by the service area, take the second exit and keep going straight on Rts. 9/126 west for approximately 3 miles.
- Just before 3 miles, you'll see a road sign for "35mph/curve." At the flashing light, make a left at Spears Corner (also Bog Hill Road).
- Go for about a mile and follow the road to the right as it curves and crosses Horseshoe Pond. The road becomes Dennis Hill Rd.
- Go about another mile up the hill. Fran's house is on the right at the top of the hill white cape, red barn. Big field on the left.

New Covid Protocols — Please Read!

Temple Beth El has put new Covid protocols in place for all in-person, inside gatherings at the Temple.

- Masks will be required inside the synagogue building unless you are on the bimah leading the congregation. Seats will also be spaced farther apart than in the past, and we'll be opening windows to increase ventilation.
- Masks are required inside the Shuman Center.
- Day Two Rosh Hashanah services will be outside. Masks will only be required if weather forces us to move services inside.
- To make socializing and eating safer, the Temple will be renting and setting up a tent outside for the Lipman Kiddush on Rosh Hashanah and the Yom Kippur break fast. If needed, please bring your own camp chair, as our two-dozen folding chairs will be for those who need to sit.
- If you want to bring food for the Kiddush or the break fast, keep it to desserts that can be picked up singly cookies and cupcakes, for example.
- Zoom will be available for all HHD services. If you are sick, we ask that you stay home and participate via Zoom.



After the second lot is full we ask that you park on the river side of Sewall street (the east side). When parking on Woodlawn, please take care not to block our neighbors' cars or driveways.
